

Privacy Notice - Visitor Willemdok (EN)

PSA Breakbulk may process your personal data when you visit our offices at Willemdok. This privacy notice covers the personal data we process from you during your visit.

PSA Breakbulk NV ("PSA Breakbulk", "we", "us"), having its registered office at Napelsstraat 79, 2000 Antwerp (Belgium), with company registration number 0689.746.214, is responsible for processing your personal data.

What personal data do we process?

We only process personal data we collect directly from you when you register at the front desk, i.e. name, first name, company, email address.

While you are at our office location, you will also be filmed by our surveillance cameras, no audio is recorded.

We will store your personal data for as long, yet no longer as legally required.

Why and how do we process your personal data?

We process your personal data to register you in our visitor log. After the registration you will receive a visitor-badge, which must be worn visibly at all times and which grants limited access to the building. Upon return of the visitor-badge, you will be signed out of the visitor log.

We process surveillance footage to prevent crimes and detect unauthorized access or threats to the safety of the office location in accordance with the Belgian Camera Act of March 21, 2007.

On what grounds do we process your personal data?

We process your personal data on the legal ground of legitimate interest pursued by the controller, respectively article 6.1 f) of the General Data Protection Regulation (2016/679). We process your personal data for general safety, security, and access control purposes.

Do we share your personal data with third parties?

In case this is required for the processing activity your personal data can be shared with other entities in the PSA group. Where we have contractual obligations your personal data can also be shared with our partners (e.g. security firm). We ensure that these recipients process your personal data in compliance with the applicable legislation. Where recipients process your personal data outside of the European Economic Area we will conclude the necessary (contractual) safeguards (e.g. EC Standard Contractual Clauses or similar contractual safeguards) in order for your personal data to have an adequate level of protection.

If it is legally justified or required, your personal data can also be passed on to the competent authorities or other authorities involved in law enforcement (police, customs, investigation judge, etc.).

How do we keep your personal data safe?

We take technical and organisational measures to ensure that your personal data is protected from unauthorized access, deletion or unlawful processing. We will make reasonable efforts to ensure that your privacy interests are protected in accordance with the applicable laws.

What are your rights in regards to your personal data?

You have the right to access your personal data and to correct it in case it is inaccurate or incomplete, have it removed or its processing restricted, to obtain a copy of your personal data, all if the legal conditions for these rights have been met.
